Recommendations for improvement

- The percentage of enrolled students in the Faculty of Social Welfare's Department of Health and Welfare and the Faculty of Child's Department of Child Studies is below 70% of total capacity, and improvements are required.
- Article 45-2 of the Private Schools Act stipulates that the creation of a business plan is obligatory, but it has not been created and improvements are required.
- Improvements are required concerning the fact that total capacity is not being adequately met and an annual business plan is not being created, and it cannot be said that internal quality assurance is functioning properly. Accordingly, improvements are required.
